#### PASTOR'S CORNER

Galatians 5:1, "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage."

In June 1776, the General Congress appointed a committee to draft a Declaration of Independence. The thirteen colonies represented at Congress unanimously voted to approve the Declaration of Independence on July 2, 1776, and on July 4 it was signed by John Hancock and sent to England. John Adams wrote a letter to his wife Abigail, which said: "The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch [time] in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary Festival. It ought to be commemorated, as the Day of Deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty... You will think me transported with enthusiasm, but I am not. I am well aware of the toil and blood and treasure that it will cost to maintain this Declaration, and support and defend these States. Yet through all the gloom I can see the rays of ravishing light and glory. I can see that the end is worth more than all the means; that posterity will triumph in that day's transaction..." We are forever indebted to our forefathers and founding fathers for the sacrifices they made and the vision they had for future generations. The preamble to the Declaration of Independence says, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness."
